### DETR Releases Local Area Employment Statistics for March

According to the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation's ([DETR](#)) March 2025 economic report, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.7 percent in March 2025 which decreased by 0.1 percentage points (pp) from February 2025. Seasonally adjusted estimates account for regularly seen economic patterns, with the following estimates not seasonally adjusted.

In the three Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA), the unemployment rates were 5.6 percent in the Las Vegas area, 4.7 percent in Reno, and 4.5 percent in the Carson area in March 2025.

In Nevada's counties, the lowest unemployment rate was in Elko County at 4.3 percent, and Mineral County had the highest rate at 9.6 percent. For a look at the unemployment rate in your county, visit our [Area Profiles Page](#).

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## Counties and Cities Employment & Unemployment

In March 2025, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Nevada decreased by 0.1 percentage points (pp) from 5.8 percent to 5.7 percent. The unadjusted rate went down by 0.3 percentage points from 5.7 percent to 5.4 percent. The number of employed individuals in the state went up by 4,730.

At the Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) level, the state saw a decrease in unemployment rate in all three of its MSAs. In the Las Vegas MSA, the state saw a decrease in unemployment rate equivalent to 0.3 (pp), moving from 5.9 percent to 5.6 percent. The Carson City MSA saw a decrease of 0.3 pp going from 4.8 percent to 4.5 percent. The Reno - Sparks MSA saw a decrease of 0.2 pp, from 4.9 percent to 4.7 percent. These figures are not adjusted for seasonality.

At the county level, the state saw decreases in the unemployment rate in most of its counties. The counties with the largest decreases in Esmeralda, Storey, and Eureka with decreases of 1.5 pp, 0.7 pp, and 0.7 pp respectively. Meanwhile, Humboldt and Pershing saw increases of 0.1 pp and 0.1 pp respectively.

Figures for state unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program, a state/federal partnership sponsored by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS-LAUS). This program produces monthly and annual employment, unemployment, and labor force data for census regions, states, counties, metropolitan areas, and many large cities, based on place of residence. 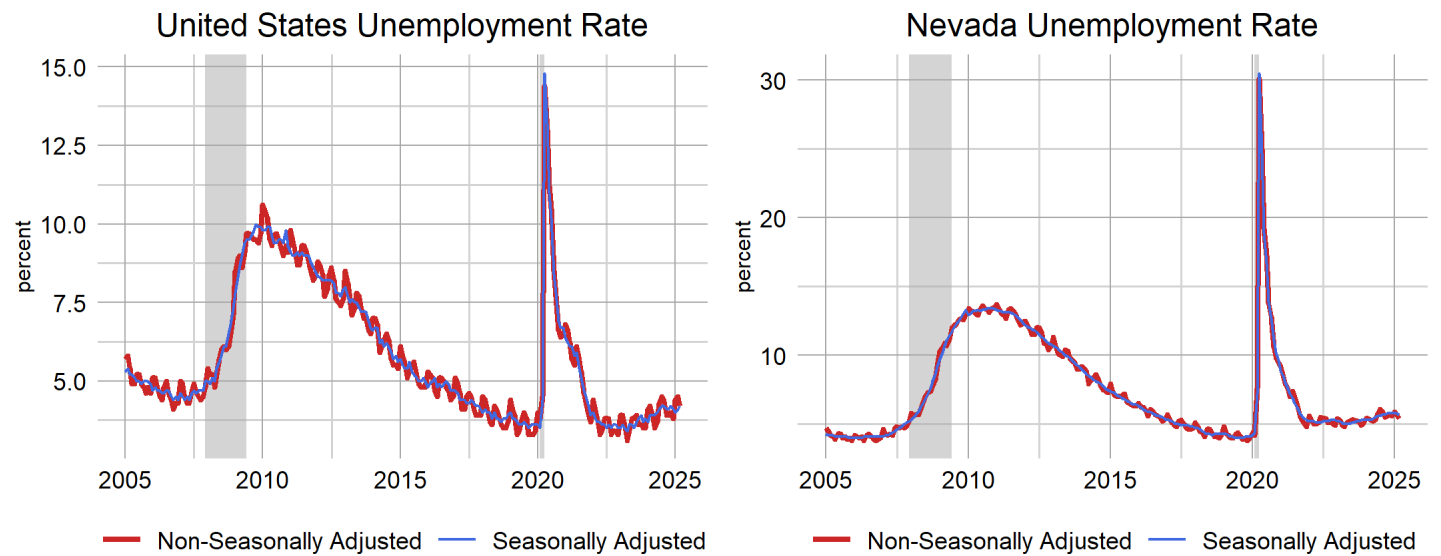

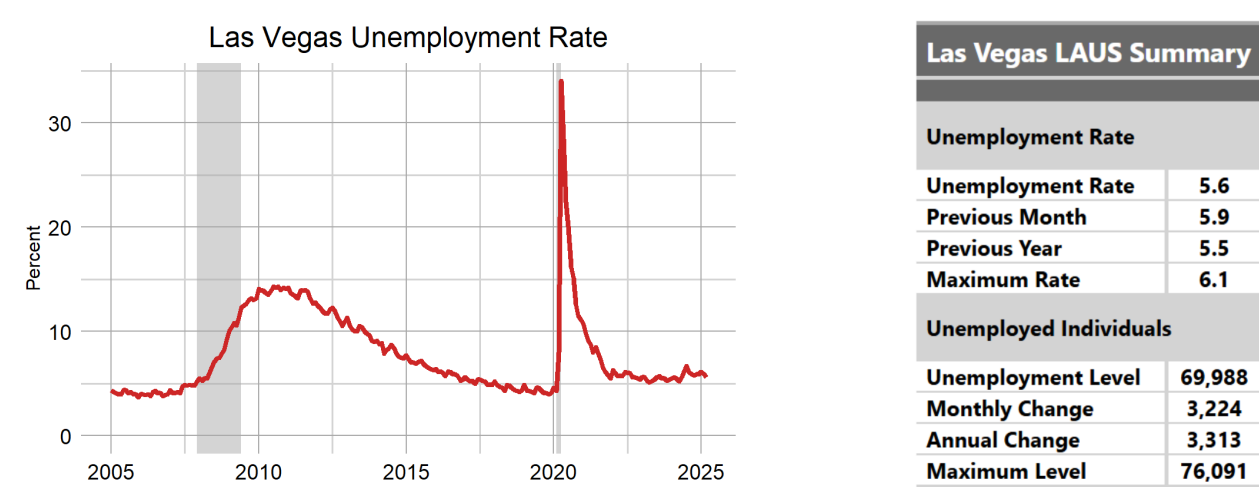

Seasonally adjusted estimates account for regularly seen seasonal employment patterns such as jobs associated with holiday hiring, holiday and weather seasons, or other jobs with seasonal components. The result of a seasonally adjusted estimate is usually a smoother estimate from which underlying economic trends can be seen. Adjusted estimates are in the summary table above, and in many of the other tables and figures throughout this document.

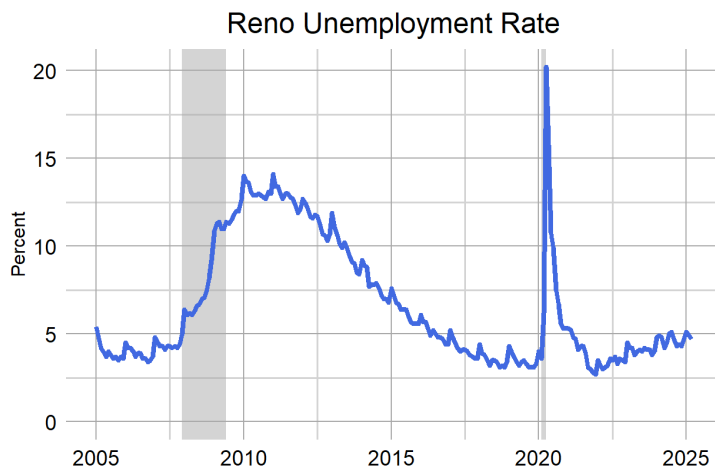
Nevada’s seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.7 percent in March, which decreased by 0.1 pp from 5.8 percent in February, and increased by 0.4 pp from 5.3 percent in 2024. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 635 from February to a current level of 95,259 people, which increased by 7,678 unemployed people since 2024. The labor force in Nevada is currently 1,670,675 people, which has increased by 4,095 people from February, and increased by 33,403 people since 2024.



The Las Vegas Metropolitan Statistical Area’s (MSA)s unemployment rate was 5.6 percent in March 2025, decreasing from 5.9 percent in February 2025, and up from 5.5 percent in March 2024, non-seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 3,224 since February 2025 for a current level of 69,988 people, which is 3,313 more unemployed people than March 2024. The labor force in Las Vegas is currently 1,241,468 people, which is 2,200 more people than in February 2025, and is up 28,525 people since March 2024.

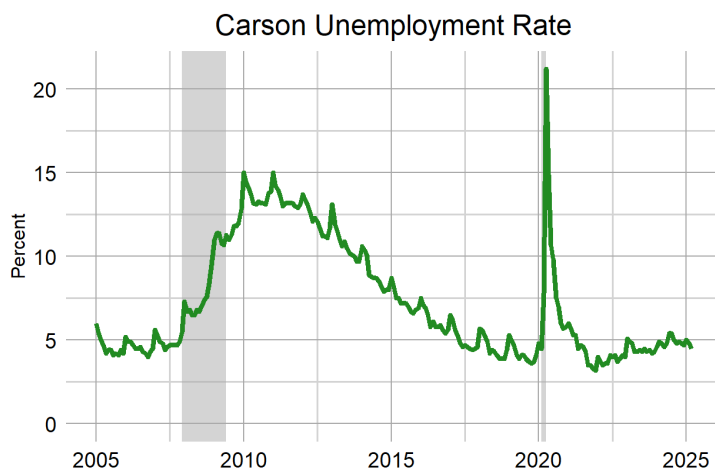


The Reno MSA's unemployment rate was 4.7 percent in March 2025, decreasing from 4.9 percent in February 2025, and down from 4.8 percent in March 2024, non-seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 648 since February 2025 for a current level of 14,328 people, which is 92 less unemployed people than March 2024. The labor force in Reno is currently 307,759 people, which is 1,172 more people than February 2025, and is up 8,939 people since March 2024.

The Carson City MSA's unemployment rate was 4.5 percent in March 2025, decreasing from 4.8 percent in February 2025, and down from 4.8 percent in March 2024, non-seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 90 since February 2025 for a current level of 1,341 people, which is 63 less unemployed people than March 2024. The labor force in Carson City is currently 30,131 people, which is 169 more people than February 2025, and is up 977 people since March 2024.

## Unemployment Insurance Benefits

In March 2025, 10,633 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, a decrease of 115 claims, or 1.1 percent, from February 2025 when there were 10,748 claims. This is a higher number of claims than were seen in March 2024, when there were 10,296 initial claims.

Looking to our measures of unemployment insurance activity, final payments were up across the state. First payments saw a decrease over the month. In Clark County, for example, first payments decreased by 25 down to 4,218 or a percentage decrease of 0.6%. Final Payments increased by 194 up to 2,204 or a percentage increase of 9.7%. Washoe County saw a decrease in first payments, with first payments going down by 81 from 770 to 689. Final payments in Washoe County were up by 18 from 211 to 229. Carson City experienced a decrease in first payments moving from 96 to 60 or a decrease of 36. Final payments in Carson City were up 1, moving from 25 to 26. Statewide, the Weeks Compensated increased by 11,732 or 12.8% over the month. Benefit Payments made increased by approximately \$5.06 million or 11.8%.

weekly claim totals since January 2020

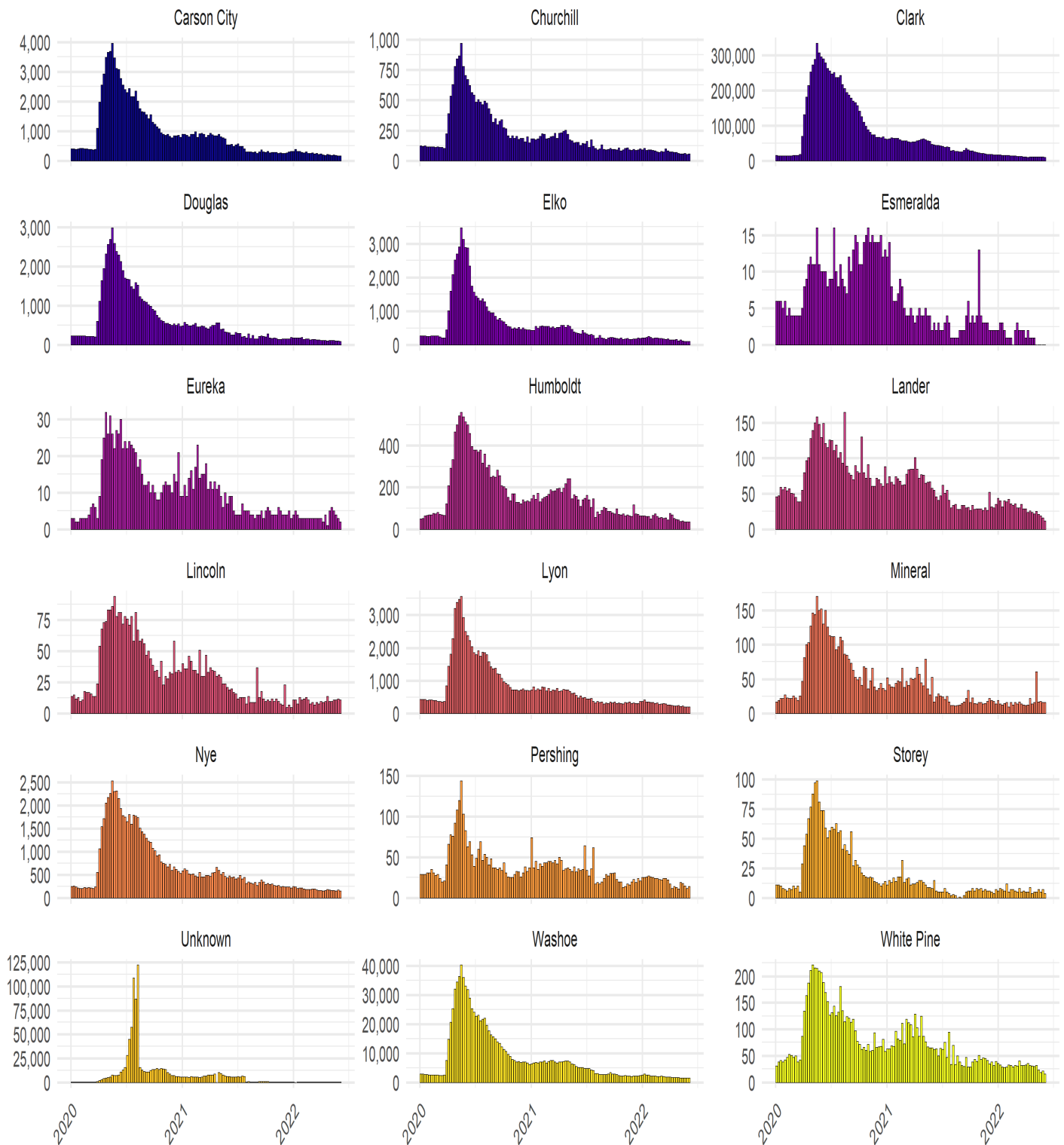
