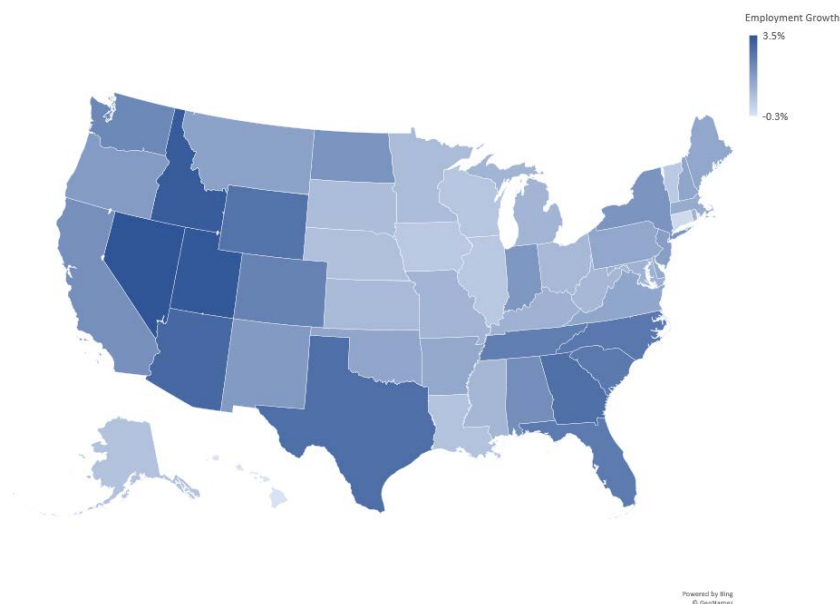

Nevada Ranks 1st in Private Sector Job Growth Over the Year; Employment up 40,950 vs. First Quarter of 2018

- Information obtained through the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) Program provides a nearly complete job count based upon quarterly wage records submitted by employers whose employees are covered under the Unemployment Insurance System. As a result, historical information is subject to minimal, if any, revisions. This data encompasses jobs in all fifty states plus the District of Columbia. Because generating this information is a time-consuming process, it is only available with a 4-5 month lag.
- With data through the first quarter of 2019, Nevada has the fastest growing private sector in the United States ahead of Utah, Idaho, and Arizona. 40,900 jobs were added relative to 2018, a growth rate of 3.5 percent.
- From 2007 to 2011, the Silver State ranked no higher than 37th of 51 in job growth rankings. For 2009 and 2010, Nevada ranked 51st in job growth. Since 2014, it has been in the top five.

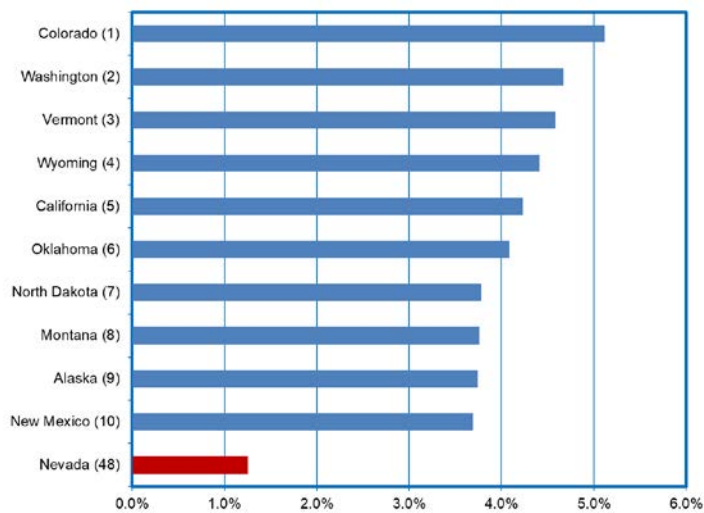


- The following table shows how each of the supersectors grew in the first quarter of 2019 with respect to the same period in 2018 and how Nevada is faring when compared to other states in that regard.
